



"And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written now with ink but with the Spirit of the Living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts."

II Corinthians 3:3

As I look over the landscape of ministry today the choices are almost limitless. Between television ministries, and live streaming ministries, and network ministries found on You Tube and other mediums, you can find almost anything you want. Unfortunately most of them fall under what I would call mindless ministry. Mindless ministry is ministry based on forms or traditions, not necessarily on devotion and desire to be a Christlike servant. It's good works that have no meaning and

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no eternal purpose. It's doing what the crowd does, and perpetuating programs just because it has always been done that way, or because it's the newest and most exciting thing around. It values performance over the heart. It's dangerous to us spiritually because it swallows up our devotion and commitment in favor of conformity to standards that make us look good, rather than accomplishing things for the Lord. It can destroy our faith.

A few years ago a scientific magazine published an article concerning a certain species of alligator. Being lazy beasts, they seldom hunt for their dinner but just wait for their unwary victims to come to them. They lie near the bank with open mouths, acting as if they are dead. Soon flies begin to light on their moist tongues, and several other insects gather. This crowd attracts bigger game. A lizard will crawl up to the alligator to feed on the bugs; then a frog joins the party. Presently a whole menagerie is there; then there is a sudden "earthquake," and WHAM the giant jaws come together and the party is over!

That is the real danger of mindless ministry. It looks good and right because everyone is in on it, but it kills and destroys. Mindless ministry is not biblical ministry. As we are going to see in our continuing study in II Corinthians there are mindless ministries and then there are biblical ministries. We have many of both today. The challenge is to look at our own ministries for the Lord to determine which we are involved in. Consider the things that you do for the Lord. There is no question that they are good works, but are they mindless actions or are they biblical ministries? How do you know the difference?

As we come to chapter 3 Paul talks about how to tell the biblical quality of a ministry. He seems to be concerned that the Corinthians are going to get the wrong idea about what he is trying to say. As the early church had grown it had become common for churches to give

letters of commendation to people who had served in their area. They functioned much like letters of reference do today. When that person left and went to another area they had a letter of commendation to smooth the way for acceptance as a legitimate teacher or minister. In his defense of his own authority as an apostle, Paul feels that he has begun to sound like he is writing his own letter of commendation. He wants to dispel that notion. The two questions in V.1 are rhetorical, "Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Or do we need as some do, letters of recommendation to you, or from you?" The answer to both is a resounding "No!" Paul's point is that he didn't need letters of commendation to validate his position and his ministry because he had met a higher standard before the Lord. He had living proof of who he was before God. All he had to do was to point out his children in the Lord. Active reproduction validated his ministry.

Active reproduction is a foreign concept to a lot of Christians. Consider this thought: "Unfortunately most Christians are sterile. That is to say they never reproduce themselves, when God has clearly commanded us to make disciples not just decisions. Maybe we should be more like the common house fly. The total offspring of a single pair of flies, if they survived to the end of the summer, would create a mound big enough to cover Germany to a depth of 46 feet. The next time you swat a house fly, remember the importance of spiritual reproduction."

The proof of Paul's ministry was the people who had come to the Lord, and who had grown in the Lord, as the direct result of his ministry. That's what he is saying in v.2: "You yourselves are our letter of recommendation, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all." Paul had ministered there, and the Spirit of God had taken hold of their hearts, and he had turned them into a spiritual letter of commendation. It was a greater commendation than that received by the ministers of the day; it was a greater commendation than that

received by Moses as he was given the Ten Commandments on tablets of stone. It was a commendation that could be seen in the change that had taken place in their lives. Jesus Christ had written Paul's commendation in the Corinthian hearts.

Active, spiritual reproduction is a distinctive of biblical ministry. Any kind of work with others can pass on knowledge or authority. Only biblical ministry passes on life. The world knows how British journalist Henry Stanley went to Africa to find the famed missionary, Dr. David Livingstone. After the two had been together for some time, Stanley saw what Livingstone endured and wrote, "I went to Africa as prejudiced as the biggest atheist in London. But there came for me a long time for reflection. I saw this solitary old man there and asked myself, 'How on earth does he stop here – is he cracked, or what? What is it that inspires him so? 'Four months after we met I found myself wondering at the old man carrying out all that was said in the Bible – 'Leave all things and follow Me.' But little by little his sympathy for others became contagious; my sympathy was aroused; seeing his piety, his gentleness, his zeal, his earnestness, and how he went about his business, I was converted by him."

Biblical ministry is marked by active reproduction of spiritual life and transformation in the lives of the people it touches. It's more than a letter of commendation. It is validated by living proof. It goes beyond outward abilities and conformity to change the heart and life. Are people being changed by what you do for the Lord?

WALKING BY FAITH - OUTDOOR ED CORREGIDOR 2024!

"The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps."

Proverbs 16:9

I spent months planning for Outdoor Ed (OE). And...things didn't go as planned (though I can't say I'm surprised). After coming back from Christmas break, I found out that the 35 person boat we were planning on using to get to Corregidor Island was not available. We started looking for other options, but they were non-existent from where we needed to leave from. The next three weeks, as we finalized everything, our boat situation was never quite settled.

The rest of the story is quite long, and I'm not going to share it all. It involves some crazy things...like me talking with the Coast Guard, writing a letter to the Philippine Navy, changing boats often, and more. Each day was a step of faith. Each day was a test of trusting the Lord

to provide and stepping out, even when I didn't know what was going to happen. I was frequently reminded of the story of the Israelites as they were told to cross the Jordan River into the Promised Land. The priests carried the Ark of the Covenant at the front of the group, and they were to walk across the Jordan River. However, the river didn't part for them until their toes touched the water as they took the first step to cross.

The entire trip, we never had a clear, final solution for our boat situation. But God was faithful. We had to change schedules almost every day, but we were still able to get all of our students and supplies across to Corregidor and back each day. To be honest, there were times during the week where I thought "Why are we even doing this? Is this worth it?" Don't get me wrong...so much of Outdoor Ed was great! But the hassle of the boat situation was so consuming and frustrating that it made me question.

But then the Wednesday after Outdoor Ed, we had our Outdoor Ed Chapel. Many students stood up and shared what God had done and taught them through their OE experience. And God confirmed that it was worth it. Even if He changed one life, the whole thing was worth it! The students shared about ways they grew and things they learned that they never would have learned just being in the classroom. And I continue to see how God used OE to build relationships among the students and staff, which are bearing fruit even today.

I'm thankful for all that God taught our students, staff, and me on this trip. I pray that we would all be more like Jesus and walk more closely with Him because of these adventures and experiences! Thank you all for praying for us throughout this journey and praying for me as I planned it all!

Missions as compared to Zwieback (In Darwin's words)

I would like to compare zwieback to missions. I have been a missionary for couple of decades today and so this qualifies me to speak about missions, but I have never once made zwieback so please be gracious to me as I compare the two.

First comparison is that missions and zwieback are both challenging to define what exactly they are - missions is generally assumed that it is bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to a people who don't know Jesus. Not all missionaries are on the front lines bringing the good news, some missionaries support those that are on the front lines bringing the good news.

Zwieback is bread but that definition depends on where you live and your upbringing. There are varying spellings and pronunciations of the word. Some would say that Mennonites invented zwieback and others would say it is from a certain place in the world. The zwieback that I grew up with was soft, rich, buttery double buns made by pinching off

one ball of dough the size of a golf ball and then a smaller ball that is pressed into the larger ball. Karen when she was first introduced to Zwieback, she just called it a "bun with a lid on it".

Some would demand that to be a missionary you need to cross some cultural barrier, or you need to travel to some place other than your home area to be a missionary. Others would argue that we all need to be a missionary and that we are all tasked with sharing the good news with those whom we live.

Some would demand that only people who were born in a certain upbringing can make zwieback and there are those who have never heard of a zwieback till today. They may have never eaten a warm zwieback in their life but may eat an avocado several times a week. There are people who have never eaten an avocado and there are others who have never eaten a zwieback.

There are many kinds of missionaries. Missionaries that pay missionary's their salary and reimbursements, there are missionaries that teach other missionary's kids, there are missionaries that are professional counsellors, there are missionaries that use camping, cooking, or horses, or teaching English as their method of telling the good news to others.

So how can we summarize this comparison between missions and zwieback? Let's follow God's plan for your life and be a missionary - however you want to define it and those who want to eat zwieback - however they want to eat it and whatever we do let's make sure we are following the Word of God, and we are listening to what God wants us to do. The truth be known there are people who don't know the good news and we are commanded to share the good news of Jesus with others. If you desire to eat bread and you call it zwieback - enjoy your bread and share your bread with others who don't know

what it is.

*Disclaimer: If you find some theological issues with something I said please give me a lot of latitude as it is not easy to compare missions to zwieback.

HARLAN MOSS - PRISON LIGHTHOUSE MINISTRY



March 2024

"And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh...your old men shall dream dreams and your young men shall see visions." Joel 2:28

It is true that God speaks mainly through His Word, but I believe He also speaks to people in other ways that draw them to Himself and His Word. I have read that Jesus is appearing in dreams to Muslims in the Middle East. After they see Jesus in their dreams, He leads them to the people who will explain the gospel to them.

Joe has had some interesting dreams! I had not met him until the day he stepped into the office to tell me the dream he had a few years earlier. He said that in his dream, "Buildings were crumbling, and the sky became a dark gray. Then a bright light appeared coming out of the sky and I heard a voice saying, 'I am coming soon.' I don't know much about the Bible, but my mom is a Christian. When I was growing up, I was continually getting in trouble, and have been in and out of prison for the last 15 years. Since I had that dream, I can't get it out of my mind. I know God was speaking to me to get right with Him." I had the privilege of explaining the gospel to him. Joe

told me he was ready to follow Jesus and give up his old sinful life. After praying Joe said, "Man I just feel such peace and joy. I can't wait to get back to my cell and read my Bible!" When I visited with him a week later Joe told me, "I talked with my mother the other day about all the negative things that are going on with my family. Anger started to rise up within me against my siblings for messing up and causing my mom problems. I said to Mom, 'Let's pray for them'. After I prayed with her there was silence on the phone, and I realized she was crying. When I asked her why she was crying, she said, 'Because I never thought the day would come when you would pray with me!' My old friends are asking me what has happened to me because they see me happy. They told me, 'We just can't see you with a Bible and going to church.' They can't understand why I don't want to fight anymore." Later Joe told me, "My celli (who is a Christian) is asking me why I am not picking up the Bible. I told him there just seems to be a mind block when I pick up my Bible and I don't know what it is." We talked about unforgiveness against others who hurt him in the past. I reminded him what Jesus said in Matthew 18 about how He would deliver the unforgiving person, "to the tormentors/jailors" until they forgive others from the heart. The one who has unforgiveness will be held captive by his/her unforgiveness. Joe admitted that he did have unforgiveness. He had five names that came to his mind. Joe prayed for God to forgive him for his unforgiveness, and asked God to bless them.

Joe told me, "The Bible is awesome, when I read it, it is reading me!" He meant it touched his inner being!

God is at work in the prison and it is a privilege for me to walk with these men who are beginners in the faith!

PAKISTAN: Young Girl Forcibly Converted

On the night of February 11th, ten-year-old Laiba Suhail was abducted from her home in the Faisalabad District of Punjab. The Christian girl's captor has been identified as Muhammad Mohsin Shah – a man who is well known in the area for abducting and forcibly converting girls from religious minorities.

When Laiba's parents approached Muhammad, he dismissed them by asserting that she had willingly embraced Islam. In response to the incident, court officials ruled to send Laiba to a women's shelter rather than returning her home. The parents were refused any contact with their daughter during the hearing, even though the young girl was present.

The Christian family has since learned that Muhammad managed to take Laiba from the women's shelter. Her parents are now concerned that she may have been sold to sex traffickers. At last report, Laiba's family members were pursuing all efforts to regain custody, but they are extremely poor due to the ill health of Laiba's father. They are endeavouring to obtain a lawyer to file a motion with the Lahore High Court.

The plight facing Christian women and girls in Pakistan is deeply concerning. Despite court rulings that have been established to protect females of minority groups, many authorities throughout the country frequently disregard these laws. As a result, on February 28th, the Lahore High Court ordered the government to implement stricter enforcement of anti-child marriage laws. Pressure has also been applied to enact tighter regulations relating to forced conversions.

Please uphold this distraught family in your prayers, asking the Lord to mightily intervene in the situation and ensure Laiba is safely returned to the custody of her loving parents. May God grant this young girl divine protection, healing and comfort, meeting her every need now and in the future. Pray that the laws designed to protect vulnerable minorities in Pakistan will be tightened and more strictly enforced by the country's authorities so that such incidents can be prevented from happening in the lives of other innocent victims and their families.

CHINA: Another Church Ordered to Remove Crosses

For more than 30 years, crosses were allowed to be displayed by Christian churches throughout China. However, as of 2014, the situation began to reverse. Beginning in Zhejiang Province, over 1,000 crosses were forcibly removed from Christian buildings over a three-year period. The enforcement of that campaign then spread to other provinces.

On March 10th, the Wangfenggang Christian Church in the Xiejiaji district of Huainan City, Anhui Province, received written notice from village administrators ordering the removal of a cross from the top of their building, as well as one that was placed above the facility's door. The notice stated that the crosses were "safety hazards."

The cross above the door has been securely in place for 40 years. The one on the roof was installed five years ago in compliance with applicable

building standards – plus, it passed a safety inspection. The claim from the village committee appears to be an arbitrary demand without basis. It is uncertain if there are any legal premises for this notice and whether the village committee has the authority to enforce such a demand.

Pressure on the country's Christians from various levels of government has been increasing throughout China as the Chinese Communist Party endeavours to take control of all aspects of society.

Pray for wisdom on behalf of the leaders of this church as they determine their next steps of action in response to this demand. May God also guide these leaders as they continue ministering to the members of their church and reaching out to others in the community. In general, please prayerfully remember Christians throughout China who are likewise facing increased pressure to submit to the government's repressive policies, asking our Heavenly Father to sustain them with His reassuring presence, strength and peace.

PAKISTAN: Christian Sentenced to Life in Prison for Alleged Blasphemy

On March 18th, 2022, Fansan Shahid was taken from his home in Lahore and charged with blasphemy. The charges arose after the Christian man purportedly commented on photos of suicide bombings that occurred in Sri Lanka. As the attackers appeared to be Muslims, his accuser alleged that Fansan's social media comment insulted the Islamic prophet Muhammad.

During interrogation, Fansan was coerced into confessing – something he later retracted during his trial. He further stated that the phone he used to make the comment has been lost since 2019. Despite the missing phone and his denial of any involvement, the Christian father of two was convicted and sentenced to life in prison on January 24th of this year.

In response to the verdict, Fansan's sister Sonia stated: "We are deeply shocked by the conviction of Fansan. We are praying for justice and [his]

release through appeal." The family has been forced to relocate due to concerns for their safety.

Please lift up Fansan before God's throne of grace as he faces the accusations against him. Pray that his appeal hearing will be successful, and that consequently he would be released from custody. Ask the Lord to ensure the safety of this accused believer and his family, as well as any other Christians in their community who may be at risk. May the Holy Spirit work mightily within the hearts and minds of citizens throughout Pakistan – including those serving as legislators – so that the country's widely abused blasphemy laws would be repealed.

The world is a vast, interconnected web of spiritual and cultural diversity. Spreading the word about Jesus in areas where Christians are the minority can seem daunting. Fortunately, if you listen closely, God will light the way for you.

Learn about SEND teammate Grace's journey towards spiritual fulfillment in areas that are typically hard to reach and how she found her purpose by following the path that God laid out for her.

If you close your eyes and try to picture a map of the world, you might see, in your mind's eye, the continents of the world, the giant land masses of Asia, Africa, South America, and so on. Or maybe you can visualize a few big countries like China, Nigeria, Ukraine, India, Brazil, or France. But can your mind's eye picture the complex interconnection of multiple cultures, peoples, and languages that make up hundreds of local communities all over the globe? What a swirling interwoven masterpiece that is! These culturally complex communities and people movements are global realities that our God sees, and that he can use for His glory.

Even in our globally-connected world, our modern eyes often cannot see the many different ethnic groups, multi-cultural societies, or people migrations that exist in hundreds of "dots" on the map all around the world. But this reality is most people's lived experience on earth, and an experience that God is already using to build gospel bridges to places and peoples that are hard to reach with the Good News of Jesus.

This is the movement of God's Spirit to bring the Good News of Jesus to every tongue, tribe, and nation. SEND Eurasia seeks to participate in God's movement to send his people from hundreds of points on the globe

to hundreds of culturally and linguistically complex, local points full of people He loves.

When God Called Grace

This miraculous movement of people can be seen in the story of our very own SEND teammate, Grace P. Grace's story demonstrates this extraordinary wisdom of God in leading his people from everywhere to everywhere for his glory.

Grace comes from Quezon City, Metro Manila in the Philippines. Her story begins right in her own community. She began walking with Jesus as her Savior on May 16, 1985, when she was 15 years old. As she grew in her understanding of Jesus and his love for her, Grace's heart to serve grew as well, and she began to serve his people through music ministry, Sunday school teaching, and in many other ways. Grace also grew in her desire and skill in sharing the gospel and got involved in the evangelistic outreach of her church.

Every story starts right where a person finds themselves. But Jesus always grows his children to move beyond their comfort zone. Grace soon had opportunities while she was working, after university, to minister on short-term, cross-cultural trips. Then, God took Grace to a different part of her own country, to the southern island of Mindanao. There she encountered people of a very different faith, and there she was challenged to follow God deeper into the nations, even farther away.

Grace Responds to God's Calling

That experience was almost 20 years ago for Grace. Since then, God opened doors for Grace to receive more ministry and vocational training. God led Grace from a less-focused calling to a specific burden and a specific path to serve in his harvest in Central Asia. He never gave her more than a few new steps at a time, and there were challenges, reversals, and moments of stalling along the way. But she now looks back at almost ten years of adaptation, of language learning, and of relational ministry with people she loves because God first loved her, and first loved them.

God has given Grace some foundational gifts which bless her and help her bless others. She sees her own Filipino cultural heritage as a gift from God which has helped her to connect with Central Asian people, who often feel a connection to her culturally. She sees the Word of God as deep daily nourishment that she truly lives on. And she sees along the way, that God has given her mentors, trainers, senders, and teammates who have also shaped and strengthened her.

From everywhere to everywhere is not a movement of only one lone person. It is a community movement. From the beginning, the church was an intercultural team movement:

1 Now Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius from Cyrene, Manaen, who grew up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul were prophets and teachers in the church at Antioch. 2 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set Barnabas and Saul apart for me to do the work for which I called them." 3 Then they fasted and prayed, laid their hands on them, and let them go. 4 After they had been sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went to Seleucia and from there sailed to Cyprus. 5 Arriving in Salamis, they began to preach God's word in the Jewish synagogues. They also had John to help them (Acts 13:1-5).

Do a little geographical digging and you'll find that these saints came from very different local communities. Why would God throw together such a motley crew? How were they able to serve in unity?

Short answer?

It brings him glory when his people live with one another in a way completely contrary to the world around them, and he gives us what we need.

14 For it is he who is our peace. Through his mortality he made both groups one by tearing down the wall of hostility that divided them. 15 He rendered the Law inoperative, along with its commandments and regulations, thus creating in himself one new humanity from the two, thereby making peace,

16 and reconciling both groups to God in one body through the cross, on which he eliminated the hostility. 17 He came and proclaimed peace for you who were far away and for you who were near. 18 For through him, both of us have access to the Father by one Spirit. 19 That is why you are no longer strangers and foreigners but fellow citizens with the saints and members of God's household, 20 having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, the Messiah Jesus himself being the cornerstone. 21 In union with him the whole building is joined together and rises into a holy sanctuary for the Lord. 22 You, too, are being built in him, along with the others, into a place for God's Spirit to dwell (Ephesians 2:14-22).

What a privilege to come together from everywhere to serve everywhere people need Jesus, and to go together where the Gospel hasn't yet gone.

Grace's team in Central Asia is just one of our SEND Eurasia teams looking for more teammates. We are praying for Jesus followers called from everywhere to serve in the masterpiece of multi-cultural communities one finds in Eurasia.
